Snohomish County Solid Waste Customer Fees Changing in 2026

Snohomish County Council approved increasing waste disposal fees at county-operated transfer stations and drop box sites starting Jan. 1, 2026.

Snohomish County's Solid Waste Division operates seven public facilities and processes approximately 670,000 tons of waste each year. The division works with local garbage collection companies that transport collected waste to county-run transfer stations for consolidation and shipment to the Roosevelt regional landfill in eastern Washington's Klickitat County.

Recycling services and Household Hazardous Waste disposal for residential customers will remain available at no charge.

The widespread fee increase is the first since 2009 and will allow the Solid Waste Division to maintain current levels of service. Customer fees are the primary funding source for the division—it is not supported by tax dollars.
